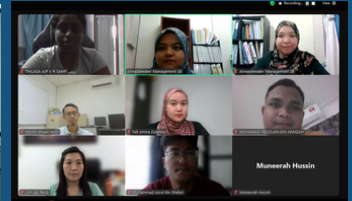

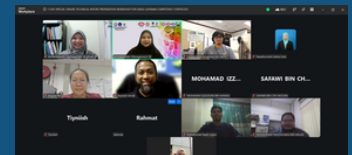

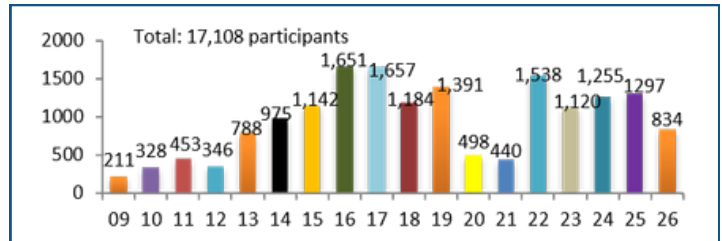

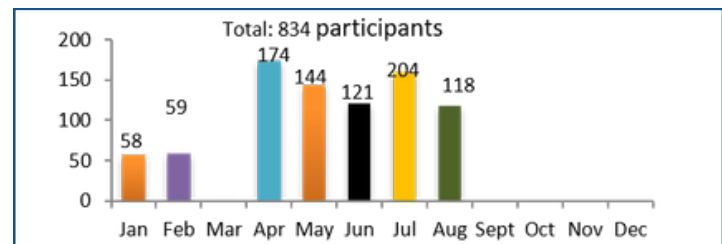

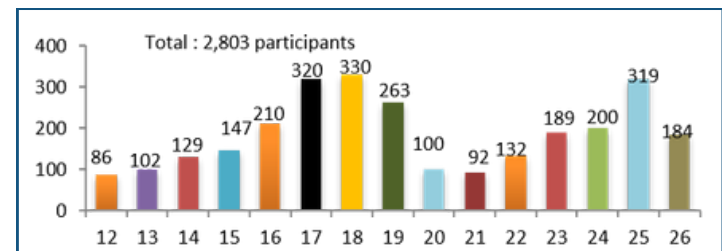
Total number of participants attending CePSWaM Courses from 2009 - 2026



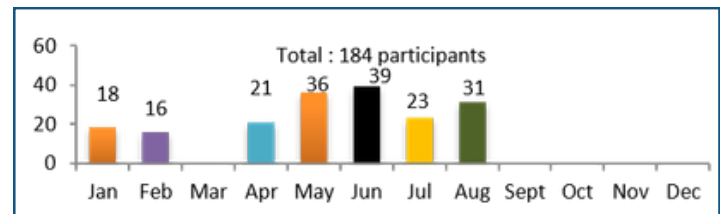
Number of participants attending CePSWaM Courses for Jan - Dec 2026



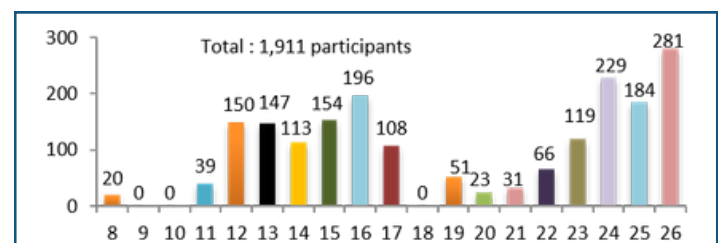
Number of participants attending CePSWaM-FTR Workshops (TRPW) from 2012 - 2026



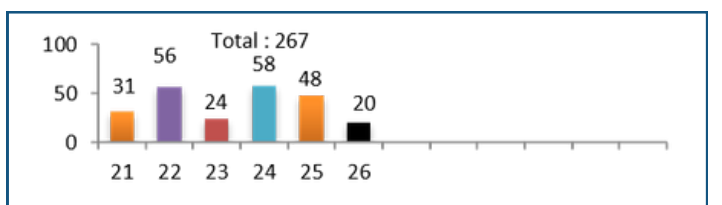
Number of participants attending CePSWaM-FTR Workshops (TRPW) for Jan - Dec 2026

Key HSE KPIs at AWWAM

Key HSE KPIs at AWWAM	What Does It Measure?
 Lost Time Injury (LTI)	Work-related injury or illness resulting in loss of working time.
 Fatality	A work-related death resulting from an occupational injury or illness.
 Dangerous Occurrence (DO)	A dangerous event with the potential to cause serious injury, fatality, or major damage, even if no injury occurs.
 Regulatory Non-Compliance	Findings related to legal, permit, licence, or regulatory requirements identified during inspections, audits, or compliance assessments.
 Manhours	Total working hours during which employees are exposed to occupational risks.
 LTIFR & FAR	Performance indicators measuring Lost Time Injury Frequency Rate (LTIFR) and Fatal Accident Rate (FAR), used to monitor workplace safety performance.

Any employee found to be in possession of or consuming alcohol or using unlawful drugs, may face strict disciplinary action, which may include:

- Reporting to the relevant authorities
- Disciplinary proceedings
- Termination of employment
